This week we are profiling second year Bulls pitcher Luc Hebert. Luc is currently in his first year at the Prairie Baseball Academy. A right handed pitcher from Cocagne, New Brunswick Luc started the 2014 Bulls season in the bullpen, but worked his way into a starting roll by the end of the campaign. Luc finished the 2014 WMBL season with a record of 3-1 a 2.41 ERA and 22 strikeouts in 37 innings. Luc is enjoying his first year at PBA where his work on and off the field have gone noticed.

"I really feel like the coaching staff at PBA have helped me with my mechanics and mental game in the off season. I am a very focused guy, and I hate losing. I go out there every time I pitch and hope to give my team a chance to win."



Consistency on the mound is something head coach Ryan MacDonald praised Hebert for. "Luc is the kind of guy who goes out there and is mature enough to compete his butt off no matter what is going on around him. He is the type of guy that I know is going to leave it all out there on the mound every time he pitches."

Luc is off to a little bit of a slow start with PBA. He had his best outing of the year last weekend against Blue Mountain Community College pitching 8 solid innings giving up zero earned runs and striking out 5. Luc will be a vital part of the PBA pitching staff this spring when they look to claim their 5th straight CCBC Championship.

As far as the summer goes Luc admits he is excited to be returning to the Bulls this summer. "Last year with the Bulls was the most fun I have had playing ball in my career. I am looking forward to another great year with a great group of guys, hopefully this year we can make a deep run into playoffs and give the great fans of Lethbridge some exciting playoff baseball."

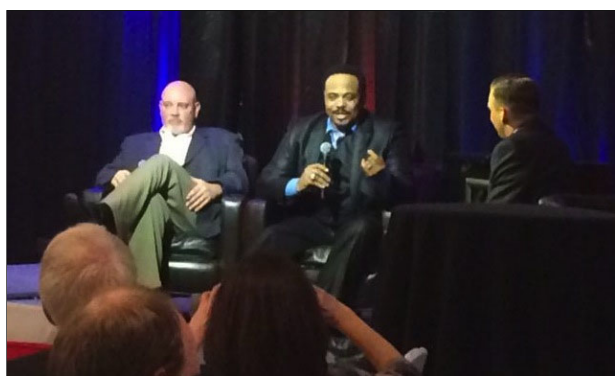

It is an exciting time around Spitz Stadium. The Bulls season is only two weeks away! Last weekend the Prairie Baseball Academy captured their 5th straight CCBC Championship at Spitz. In this weeks player profile we will look at two players who were integral parts of the championship. They are also twins. Clark and Mitch Grisbrook are from North Vancouver, BC. They also make up their own battery, Clark is a pitcher and Mitch is a catcher.

The 2015 college season was successful for both of the boys. Clark, a sophomore at the Prairie Baseball Academy was 6-0 with a 3.48 ERA in 41.1 innings. Grisbrook also struck out 22, while walking 15. Clark was at his best when it mattered most. In the third game of the CCBC Tournament Clark pitched a complete game, giving up only 3 hits and striking out 6. The win guaranteed the Dawgs the 1st overall seed in the playoff round of the tournament. Mitch Grisbrook was a first year PBA player this season. With a crowded catching depth chart it took Mitch a few series to earn his spot. In 16 regular season games Mitch hit .380 with 22 hits, 5 2B, 3 3B, 9 RBI's and 5 SB for the Dawgs. In the CCBC tournament Mitch caught 4 of the 5 tournament games, playing outstanding defensively, throwing out 4 base stealers. He also chipped in with 3 hits and 2 RBI's in a tournament low in scoring.



The Bulls coaching staff is excited to see if both boys can continue playing well and contributing for the 2015 Bulls squad. Be sure not to miss the Bulls home opener which takes place May 29 at 7:05 against the rival Okotoks Dawgs at Spitz Stadium.

Bulls Finish a Great Weekend at 3-0!



Great Weekend!

It was an exciting weekend for Lethbridge Bulls fans to say the least. When all was said and done the boys finished up 3-0, and Friday night's game at Spitz Stadium was one of the most memorable wins in recent years. The Bulls are continuing their hot play to start the 2015 campaign. Their 7-1 record is tops in the league, and puts them 1.5 games ahead of second place Edmonton in the Alberta division. Medicine Hat and Okotoks round out the division with records of 3-5 and 1-6 respectively.

Thursday night the Bulls hosted Edmonton for the first of two games. The Bulls were outplayed in every aspect of the game, dropping the contest 11-2. It was an eye opener for the boys who lost their undefeated start to the season.



In true Bulls fashion the boys bounced back and played one of the most memorable games in recent years on Friday evening. It was a fairly normal start to the game. Edmonton jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the top of the first. The Bulls answered with two runs of their own in the bottom of the second. The score remained at 2-2 until the bottom of the 5th inning when the Bulls tacked on two more runs to make the score 4-2. The back and forth contest was tied up once again in the 8th inning when Edmonton rallied with two runs off of reliever Reno Dupuis. That's where the fun started. Neither team was able to score in the 9th and the game was forced to go to extra innings. Second year pitcher Chris Stodolka was impressive to say the least. A reliever who usually only throws one or two innings was able to gut out 3 and 2/3 innings in relief for the Bulls. Heading to the 12th inning the score was still tied 4-4. After Stodolka finished the 11th, first year pitcher Andrew Grieder got into trouble to start the 12th inning. A single followed by two walks loaded the bases with nobody out. Coach MacDonald went to his bullpen and called for right handed reliever Matthew Beaton to try to get out of the jam. Beaton came up huge forcing a 5-2-3 double play, one of the hardest double plays to turn in baseball. Beaton collected the 3rd out easily after that and got the team out of the jam unscathed. Heading to the bottom of the inning the score was still tied 4-4 and the bulls had the heart of their lineup set to hit. Pidhaichuk led off the inning with a walk, and Brandon Bufton struck out. That brought veteran catcher Travis Steinke to the plate. Steinke who is known for his homerun power

did not disappoint. He sent a 1-1 pitch into the night. Steinke lined a 12th inning walk off homerun off the scoreboard in left field to end the contest. Steinke was mobbed by his teammates a home plate in front of the fans who stuck out the marathon game. The game was an emotional roller coaster and it seemed to spark the Bulls over the course of Saturday and Sunday.

The Bulls followed their exhilarating victory on Friday night at home, by heading to Okotoks for two games on the road. Saturday night was also a victory to remember for the Lethbridge Bulls. A Okotoks story written earlier in the season compared the Bulls luck in the team's first meeting on the year to a miniputt course, because the Bulls hit so many holes. Whether it motivated them or not the Bulls pounded out 20 hits on Saturday night beating the Okotoks Dawgs by a staggering 18-3 margin in front of a sellout crowd at Seamen Stadium. Mason Shiflett led the attack going 5-6 with 3 runs scored and 3 RBI's. It was a complete team effort at the plate though, every starter recorded at least one hit on the evening.

Sunday's contest at Seamen stadium was played in the afternoon on one of the nicest days of the year so far. With temperatures reaching 30 degrees the boys were able to record their 4th victory over the rival Dawgs to start the season, winning 7-3. Newcomer Tyler Gibson arrived in Canada on Saturday night, and head coach Ryan MacDonald didn't wait long to throw him into the mix. He started the Sunday afternoon game for the Bulls pitching 5 innings, with 2 ER, and 2 k's on the afternoon. On offense Mitch Dornblut led the way, he was 4-5 with a run scored and an RBI. He is now hitting .385 to start the 2015 season.

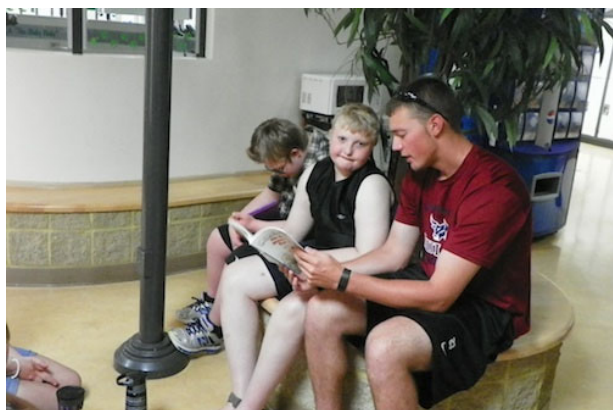

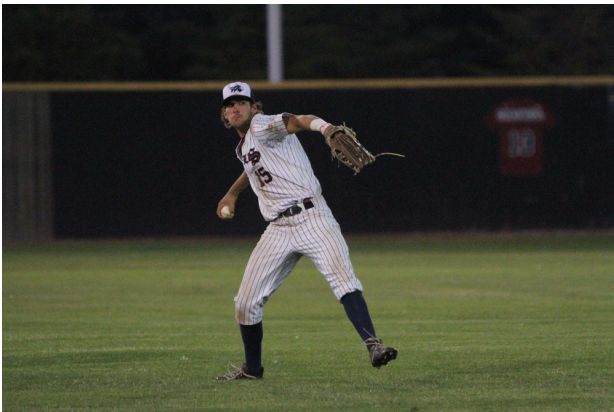

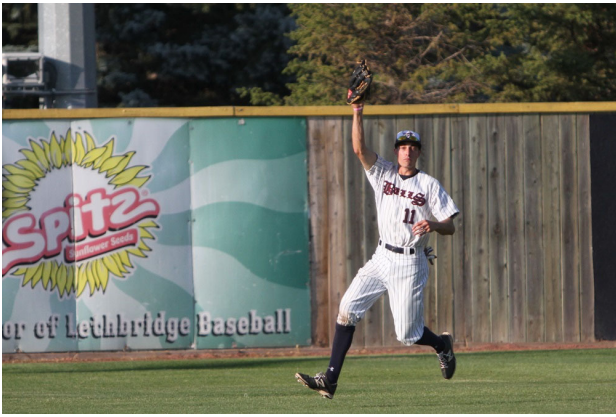

The Bulls will return home July 30th and 31st when they take on division rival Okotoks Dawgs in the last two games of the regular season.

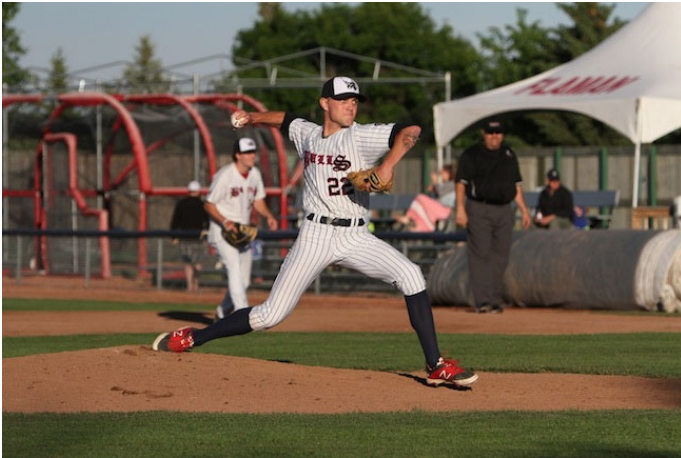

Bulls Pitcher and Emergency Left Fielder Andrew Grieder followed that sequence up with a sacrifice bunt. An out and an intentional walk to Bretton Gouthro brought Mitch Dornblut to the plate who delivered a triple into the right field corner scoring both Blad and Gouthro and the Bulls were ahead to stay 4-2. Dornblut scored on a past ball to increase the lead to 5-2.

Starting pitcher Luc Hebert gave the Bulls a solid 6 plus innings of 2 run ball but left the game in the top of the 7th after taking a line drive off his right (throwing) arm. It was later learned that he had fractured his arm on the play. Matthew Beaton (awarded the win), Reno Dupuis, and Chris Stodolka with a save pitched well in relief of Hebert's start.

The Bulls can wrap up their first WMBL Championship on Sunday afternoon in Regina at 2:05 when Game 3 is scheduled to start. Kyle Olliges is expected to be handed the ball for the Bulls.

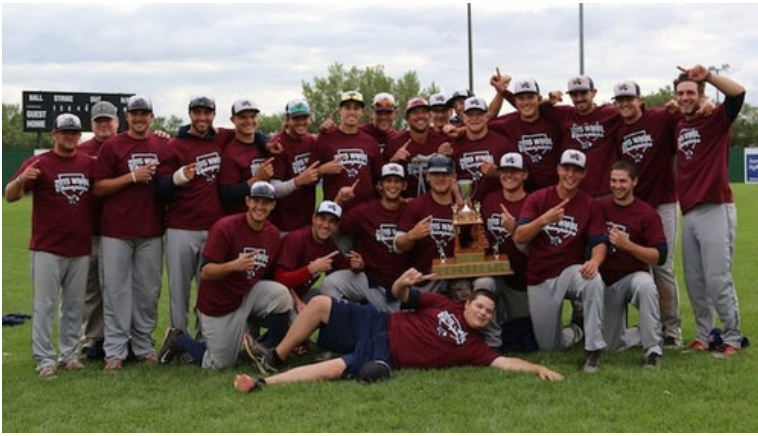
In one of the most impressive feats in recent memory the Bulls finished off a perfect playoff run going 9-0. Sunday afternoon in Regina the Bulls held on to win in an event filled 9th inning to capture their first WMBL Championship in team history. Dyson returned from a broken foot with two games to play in the regular season, and he was a huge presence in the middle of the lineup all playoffs.



Kyle Olliges started the crucial 3rd game of the series, with the prospect of a game 4 double header looming with a loss. Olliges was outstanding all day en route to his 3rd win of the playoffs. Olliges pitched 8.1 innings surrendering only 4 hits, 2 ER and striking out 5. Regina picked up an unearned run in the 2nd inning and could not get to Olliges until a valiant rally in the bottom of the 9th inning. Attempting to finish the game, Olliges gave up a lead off single to center field, followed by an unlikely error from shortstop Evan Comeau. A 3-1 putout scored a run and Coach MacDonald went to the bullpen. Bulls closer Chris Stodolka was put in the game. Stodolka gave up a single to Jager Toffan that blooped into left field and scored a run. A two out line drive with runners on

2nd and 3rd ended the game, and the boy's dogpiled high above the Currie Field pitcher's mound. Last to the dogpile was regular season MVP Brandon Bufton who made the trip on crutches after breaking his leg on a hit by pitch in game 1 of the series.

On the offensive side the Bulls continued to hit from top to bottom in the lineup like they had all playoffs. Every Bulls starter recorded a hit and 5 Bulls had multi-hit games in the 15 hit effort. Bretton Gouthro was 3-4 in his final game with the Bulls after 4 seasons. Gouthro hit an incredible .563 with 9 runs scored in the playoffs. Travis Steinke was 2-4 with 3 of the Bulls 4 RBI's on the afternoon. For the playoffs the Bulls hit .337 with 75 runs scored in 9 games.
